- Researching and identifying new grant opportunities regularly.
- Summarising relevant grant opportunities and suggest how to best respond, reporting this information to the trustees.
- Researching information and data necessary for grants and grant reporting;
- Work with the trustees to coordinate Supporting budgets for grants applications.
- Writing grant proposals.
- Maintaining necessary records, files and reports on the cloud system for grant application.
- Support the trustees and help write any required reports on how received grants are spent, as required.
